Habitat Hollow



Habitat Hollow is a fun, interactive learning experience that introduces kids to the concept of habitat with its four main elements: Food, Water, Shelter, and Space.

Project Goal: Build awareness in children and adults to help them make informed choices in order to preserve habitats for wildlife and save our own environment. Around the Farm House, Barn, and Backyard three North American habitats are showcased: Prairies, Temperate Forests and Wetlands.

PJA's involvement included conception of the interpretive storyline and design of the structures and outdoor exhibits. A number of green building technologies and materials were used in the construction of the "farm house" that houses the interactive interpretive exhibits. The insulation and wall boards were experimental recycled panels, low flow toilets and urinals were used, as well as recycled plastic products and sustainable harvested lumber.

The project opened on Earth Day 2002.
