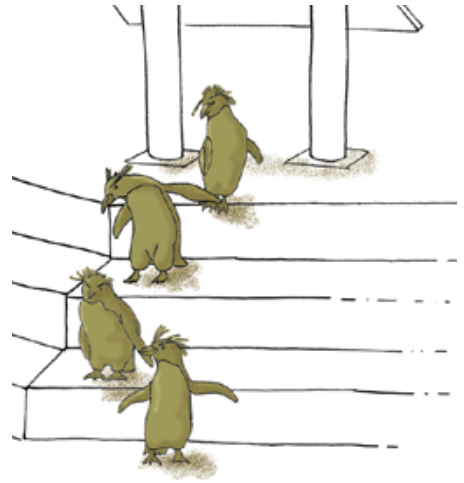




# Penguin Parade

Jurong Bird Park, Jurong, Singapore



The design for the renovation of the Penguin Building improves visitor viewing and animal holding, and gives the animal exhibits a more naturalistic look that now seamlessly merges with the visitor areas.

The new signs allows for easy and accessible identification of the various penguin, puffin, and other birds species. Interpretive panels supplement information about the chosen themes: Above-water and under-water flight and the three different habitats of the animals exhibited.

Bronze sculptures invite hands-on exploration and interaction. Show-cased are the biggest penguins in the exhibit, the King Penguins, as well as a band of Rock Hoppers hopping down stairs of the viewing platform, and the original Penguin Parade: Fairy Penguins of Australia leaving their burrows in the morning to struggle out to sea together. A rockwall hides Puffin burrows and lets children and adults explore why puffin eggs don't roll of the precarious ledges, while hanging sculptures of the acrobatic kittiwakes illustrate the flight theme.
